

COVID-19

Initiatives

- We connected with women who have been recently housed and to support and
 encourage them in their new path forward. We bring listening ears, kindness, love
 and a willingness to connect deeply. In 2021 we connected with 21 women recently
 settled into housing. We provided welcome home kits which included towels,
 sheets, housewares, small appliances, cutlery, food hampers, beauty supplies,
 clothing and shoes.
- To provide basic life necessities for those experiencing immediate homelessness and poverty. Walking the downtown streets of Calgary every week looking for those that need a hand up. Food, warm clothing, harm reduction supplies and kindness and love are shared with those who need it most. Almost 3500 fellow citizens have impacted our hearts in the last year.

Covid-19

Navigating the onboarding of new volunteers during a pandemic, finding ways to serve food to those who were hungry while limiting the spread of covid-19 were just a few of the difficult paths for our team. We found ways to recruit and train and our volunteers. Our dedicated volunteers also found creative ways to pack lunches. As we head into the fourth wave we know this will continue to impact how we gather, and ultimately how we serve. We anticipate all the possibilities that 2022 will bring.
