Community Initiatives


Coffee Connection Program

- Quarterly we connect with a local female only housing unit. We connect with women who have been newly housed to support and encourage them in their new path forward but more importantly to just connect as this is a fundamental need of humans.
- Forest Lawn Outreach
 - In January 2022 with a community funding grant provided by Telus Community Ambassadors, we initiated a second outreach team for the area of Forest Lawn. On Thursdays we provide outreach services to those in the Forest Lawn area. Basic necessities such as harm reduction, food and warm clothing are provided. During the height of the pandemic we were a constant for these folks, and they relied on our program for much needed harm reduction supplies.

Covid-19

Navigating the pandemic continued into 2022. Street Sisters Society and our dedicated volunteers continued to provide services and to date not one outreach was cancelled. We were able to utilize a program administered by the Red Cross and we provided covid rapid testing to all our volunteers to ensure every remained safe.





• <u>4024 People</u> relied on us for basic necessities in 2022. This is an increase of over 1000 people served from last year.

Community Collaboration

 In December our board President attended City Council and presented to Calgary City Council some of the very concerning issues facing unsheltered Calgarians. With the coldest months right in front of us, we advocated for warming shelters, and additional resources to support those most in need. The city heard our voices and the Winter Warming Project initiated by the Calgary Homeless Foundation was put in place as a result. Many outreach teams including Street Sisters Society participated in this successful program.
